- Differentiate between clinical data sources (e.g., EHR-based datasets, national or state registries, and social determinants of health (SDOH) surveys) to determine which tools most accurately capture the health disparities relevant to specific pediatric populations.
- Analyze common data challenges in the clinical research workflow—such as lack of standards, missing demographic variables, and algorithmic bias—to mitigate risks that could inadvertently worsen health inequities.
