

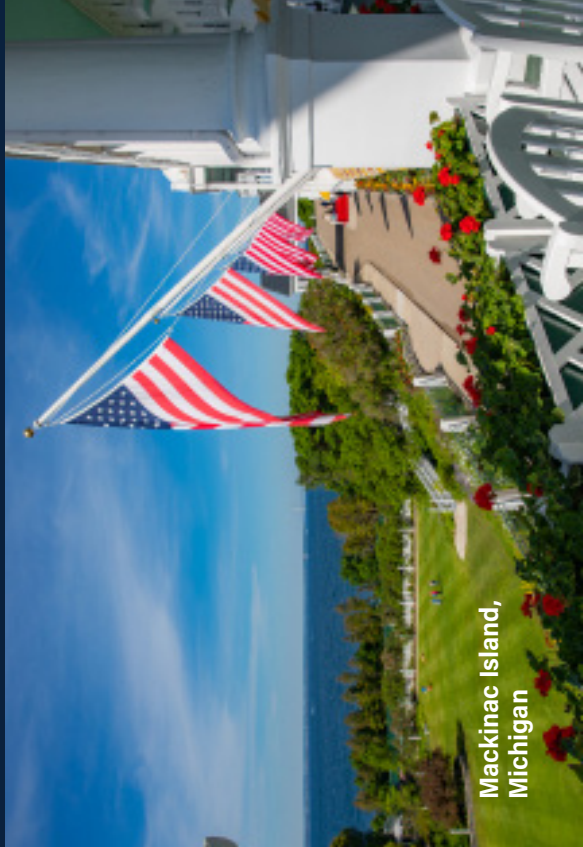

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this course, participants will be able to appropriately treat and manage different cardiovascular complications, including:

- differentiate the appropriate test(s) for noninvasive chest pain evaluation.
- evaluate targeted therapies for heart failure with reduced ejection fraction (HFrEF).
- construct antiplatelet therapy after percutaneous coronary intervention (PCI).
- summarize new and interesting cases in echocardiography.
- compare and evaluate devices in the operating room for high-risk patients.
- assess treatment plans to prevent secondary stroke.
- analyze strategies for managing patients with atrial fibrillation (AF).

GUEST ATTIRE

Discount ferry coupons for transportation to Mackinac Island will be emailed several weeks prior to the course. Pellston Regional Airport serves Mackinac City and is located 16 miles south off I-75 and Chippawa County International Airport in the Upper Peninsula located 35 minutes to the St. Ignace Ferry docks. You must pre-arrange your ground transportation to Mackinac City or St. Ignace.


